
GCSEs-The Controllable's


St Peter's behaviour systems - sanctions






St Peter's behaviour systems - praise

What opportunities are there to praise?


- We as a year group are focussing on the basics opportunities for House Points for organisation, using the journal correctly and turning up with the right equipment.
- Star of the Week nominations will continue as last year and our displayed in Form assembly.
- Celebration breakfasts termly for nominated students in each tutor group.
- Weekly house point checks in tutor times so students can receive praise from tutors and peers.
- Awards Assemblies at the end of each term for year groups



COVID - Headline changes to the school day

- Please drop off students between 8.30-8.40am when staff will be on duty to direct and ensure year groups aren't mixing. Students go straight to their tutor base from 8.30am.


Progress reports


Targeted reports process
