- Are there any particular subjects and grades you may need? If you have a particular career, job or further study in mind you may need to choose certain A-Levels.

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Tips on choosing A-level subjects

Ability and enjoyment

New subjects

Subject combinations ...

- Some subjects cover common ground!
- Some subject combinations are complementary and fit well together
- Restrictions due to GCSE grade achieved.



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Degree level course

A level subjects often required

Biology	Biology and usually Chemistry
Chemistry	Chemistry and often Maths and another science
Dentistry	Chemistry and Biology for most courses but some require Maths or Physics as well
Engineering	Maths and Physics and some universities like Further Maths (Chemistry for Chemical Engineering and sometimes Physics as well)
Maths	Maths and sometimes Further Maths
Medicine	Chemistry , Biology and Maths or Physics to keep all medical schools open to you, Chemistry and Biology to keep vast majority open, Chemistry and Maths or Physics limits your range of choices
Modern languages	Usually the language to be studied - but this may vary for less common languages and English Lit or History or Politics useful
Veterinary Science	Chemistry and Biology and one from Maths or Physics

Tips on choosing A-level subjects

Consider academic subjects which are complimentary in other ways.

E.g. Music

In the last few years Music students have gone on to top universities to study:

- Economics
- Theology
