WAVE 1	Core Provision Level 1 Funding
<p>Curriculum</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students in Key Stage 3 follow a curriculum of English, Maths, Science, RE, Humanities, ICT, PE, Drama, art, music and a Modern Foreign Language • Students in Key Stage 4 follow a curriculum of the core subjects including English, Maths, Science, RE in addition to option subjects chosen. They also continue with Curriculum PE. • Key Stage 4 students choose their options from a large list of differing qualifications including GCSE and BTEC 	<p>Pastoral</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students are assigned to a Tutor Group and have a Tutor who provides the first home school link • The Tutor meets with the students each day in tutor time for a collective prayer, where they are also available for all student concerns • The Tutor also carries out reviews of their progress • Each year group has a Head of Year who conducts assemblies and leads the year group through the team of tutors, in all school events and monitoring of academic progress • Students take part in school Masses and liturgies throughout the year in addition to days off timetable for retreats
<p>Staffing</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students have access to a Tutor, Head of Year, Subject Teachers and Heads of Departments 	<p>Environmental/Facilities</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Subjects are largely based in subject areas • There are lifts in all teaching blocks • All Students have access to appropriate seating and tables in all classrooms • All stairs accessible for student use have high contrast edging and handrails

WAVE 2	Enhanced Provision Level 2 Funding
<p>Curriculum</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students at Key Stage 4 all study the core subjects • Students at Key Stage 4 all choose GCSE/ BTEC subjects from the options outlined in the options booklet which is updated and issued to students annually • Highly able students are encouraged to do Triple Science. • Revision Classes run after school in the build-up to exams in all subject areas for students requiring support for target grades • Drop-ins operate every night in all subject areas for catch-up opportunities • During Easter holidays revision days run for Year 11 students across a variety of subjects • Key Stage 4 Subjects including English, Science, Media, BTEC and Drama offer up to 6-week enhanced learning for students needing additional support in Key Stage 4 • Math's Club operates afterschool for Years 7-9 to complete homework with support • English and Maths interventions support students improving levels including Literacy, Numeracy and Spelling groups • The Drama Department produce a show • Instrumental and vocal Music sessions take place in lunchtime and afterschool to improve confidence and performance for all Year groups 	<p>Pastoral</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We operate a reporting card system where students may report to a tutor daily to support their learning • Students may be mentored in small groups according to need • Peer Support Mentors from Key Stage 4 work with students in Key Stage 3 • Careers advice is offered throughout Key Stage 3, 4 and 5

WAVE 3	Individual Personalised Provision Level 3 Funding
<p>Curriculum</p> <p>Students in Key Stage 3 may be offered Nurture Group, this is a smaller curriculum focusing on Literacy and Numeracy. In Key Stage 4 Students may be offered Curriculum support Lessons in place of an option to do additional English, Math's, and Science.</p> <p>The SEN Department offers the following provisions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Paired reading • EAL small group and individual • Spelling small group work • Literacy small group work • Speech and Language support sessions • Handwriting skills • Keyboard skills • Numeracy intervention • Ipads • Reading intervention • SEN Testing to monitor progress • Homework Club run by LSA's for all SEN students each night² • Students can also be referred to CAMHS, ASD Outreach, Educational Psychology, Language and Learning Specialist Teachers, Behaviour Support Teachers, Pathways advisors, Sensory/Physical Advisory teachers and REMA should the need arise 	<p>Pastoral</p> <p>The SEND Department offers the following provisions;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Counselling 1:1 • ELSA 1:1 and group sessions • Mentoring • Safe SEN Room 1:1 and group sessions • Anger Management 1:1 and group sessions • Matrix 1:1 sessions • BEAT – Beat Exam Anxiety • KS4 – group sessions • Lifestyle Medicine Coaching 1:1 sessions
